

JOB OFFER

Project: "Evaluation of conservation strategies for the management of endangered or conflict species", Warsaw University of Life Sciences. The job offer relates specifically to the management plan of brown bear in Poland.

Tasks: Field work includes hair trapping for genetic and isotope analysis, camera trapping and snow-tracking. Database preparation and data processing and analysis. Collection of existing information on brown bear, logistics, preparation of reports and workshops. The field station is located in Bieszczady mountains, but the working area includes the whole range of bear distribution in Poland and the city of Kraków.

Requirements:

- Graduation in Biology, Forestry, Environmental Sciences or similar (students in the last years may be also applicable)
- Experience with fieldwork in the mountains and basic computer programmes. Some knowledge of GIS is desirable.
- Driving license and an own car; disposition to travel in the regions of bear distribution in Poland
- Good level of English language
- Motivation to work in brown bear conservation

Job conditions:

- 1500 PLN gross per month (40 hours a week)
- 1 year duration (2010)
- Flexibility in timetable and possibilities to travel
- Free living at the field station in Bieszczady (own room)
- Fixed rate per km travelled, food and costs of accommodation covered during travels
- Good working atmosphere in a nice team of young people and students volunteering
